(Scholarship recipients)

Eligibility for the scholarship is limited to **doctoral students enrolled in the upper years of a doctoral course at TUAT as of April 2023 (third-year or higher-year students in the integrated doctoral course, and second- to fourth-year students in the Cooperative Division of Veterinary Sciences in the Graduate School of Agriculture)** who have a strong will to become a "Kagayaku Doctoral Scholar".

Those who fall into any of the following categories are not eligible.

- (1) Japanese government (Monbukagakusho: MEXT) scholarship international students
- (2) Students dispatched/sponsored by foreign governments
- (3) Those who are funded under Research Fellowship for Young Scientists by Japan Society for the Promotion of Science (JSPS)*
- (4) Students who have remained in the same academic year or have been enrolled in their course of study for a period longer than the minimum period required for completing their course of study
- (5) Those who have received this scholarship twice
- (6) Those who have received other scholarships that cannot be received in duplicate

* If you are currently applying for a JSPS Research Fellowship for Young Scientists, you may apply for this scholarship. However if you are selected as a Research Fellow, your status as a scholarship recipient of this scholarship will be cancelled.

(Number of scholarship recipients)

About 20 people

(Period of scholarship)

From April 1, 2023 to March 31, 2024 or to the date of completion of the doctoral course with or without a degree, whichever comes first

(Details of the scholarship)

The amount of the scholarship is 500,000 yen.

In addition, recipients will be exempted from paying the full amount of tuition for the first and second semesters of the 2023 academic year. However, there will be no overlap with the regular tuition waiver if your tuition is already waived. Students who will complete their

doctoral course with or without a degree in September will be exempted from paying tuition only for the first semester.

(Application for scholarships)

Those who wish to receive the scholarship should submit the separate scholarship application form (Appendix Form 1) and other related documents to Student Affairs Section, Educational Affairs Office, Educational Affairs Division by the deadline.

(Decision of scholarship recipients)

Scholarship recipients will be selected based on an initial document screening and a second screening based on an interview, conducted by the President and other board members of TUAT.

(Submission of an activity report)

Scholarship recipients are required to submit a report on their activities, Appendix Form 2, by the end of April 2024.

(Cancellation of scholarship decision)

If any of the following events occur, the scholarship decision will be revoked.

- (1) The student loses his/her status as a student of TUAT.
- (2) The student is selected as a JSPS Research Fellow.
- (3) The student is subject to disciplinary action in accordance with TUAT's academic regulations.
- (4) The student is otherwise found to be ineligible for the scholarship.

(Returning the scholarship amount received)

If your scholarship decision is revoked in accordance with the preceding paragraph, if you become a recipient of another scholarship that cannot be received in duplicate, or if you do not submit an activity report by the due date, you may be requested to return the scholarship amount you have already received.

Returning of the waived tuition is in accordance with Article 8, Paragraph 2 of the TUAT Regulations on Tuition, etc. Exemption and Postponement.

(Reference)

TUAT Regulations on Tuition, etc. Exemption and Postponement (English translation of the excerpted, original in Japanese only)

Article 8 If a person has been granted a tuition fee waiver and if it is recognized that the reason for the waiver has disappeared after the decision of the granting of the waiver was made, the President of TUAT will revoke the granting of the waiver with discussion by the Education and Student Life Committee.

2 Those who have had the decision of the granting of the tuition waiver revoked according to the preceding paragraph shall pay the following amount by the last day of the month that includes the date of the revoke: (the total amount of the exempted tuition for which the exemption was granted) ÷ (the number of the exempted months) x (the number of

months counting from the month that includes the date of the revoke to the ending month of the exempted period).
